I am pleased to report that fiscal year 2012 was another banner year for the K-State Alumni Association as we continued to break records in a number of areas.

As you know, the Association's mission is to enhance our K-State family through lifelong involvement. Our commitment for achieving that mission is to provide opportunities that encourage alumni and friends to stay engaged with the university and with fellow K-Staters.

For three consecutive years, we've surpassed prior records in constituent participation. In FY2012, more than 90,000 K-State

family members and friends participated in nearly 1,000 Association activities offered around the world – nearly 10 percent over the prior year. When including participation at the 2012 Cotton Bowl festivities, the Association's engagement rate increased nearly 40 percent. It was heartwarming to see nearly 20,000 loyal Wildcat fans at the Cotton Bowl pep rally.

In addition to events that link K-Staters for life, the Association supports strategic initiatives that enhance the student experience, such as our scholarship programs. In FY2012, alumni and friends broke records again by providing funds that enabled the Association to pay more than \$228,000 in scholarships to K-State students. Our scholarship funding has increased by 37 percent over the past four years.

The success of the Association comes through the steadfast support of its members, board, staff and friends. Nearly 40,000 members strong, our Association has come a long way since its humble beginnings in 1874. As we prepare to celebrate K-State's 150th anniversary in the year ahead, I look forward to more opportunities to engage the K-State family and break even more records. Thank you for your continued support.
