Fiscal year 2016 marked the first year of the Alumni Association's five-year strategic plan, which was developed under the leadership of my predecessor, Roger McClellan '88. Entitled "Leading and Inspiring Lifelong Involvement," the plan strikes an inclusive note, focusing

on the Alumni Association's service to the university and "all members of our Wildcat Community." Although the goals are ambitious, the Alumni Association already is making significant progress across many of the key objectives.

Ambitious plans demand resources, and our generous alumni continue to answer the call. This was another record-breaking year for the Alumni Association's annual fund, Tradition Founders, which supports many important programs. Donors provided \$581,527, including 176 Founders Circle members with gifts of \$1,000 or more.

K-Staters also reached new heights with the success of the Powercat affinity license plate program. The K-State plate is the most popular affinity license plate in Kansas by a wide margin, and through the years it has generated more than \$3 million for student scholarships and recognition programs. It's great to see so many Powercats on the road throughout Kansas!

Speaking of Kansas, it's no secret that the state government continues to face significant budget challenges. Public universities have suffered deep cuts that shortchange today's students and increase the barriers to higher education. Elected officials' shortsightedness will hurt K-State for decades — frustrating our ability to keep pace with urgent needs and placing us at a significant competitive disadvantage compared to our peer institutions.

Recognizing these challenges, the Alumni Association continues to help alumni advocate for K-State (and all higher education funding) in Topeka. Given the critical issues at stake, it is now more important than ever that we as K-Staters make our voices heard.

Alumni voices also are an important part of the process of selecting a new university president. Alumni Board member Sylvia White Robinson '71 and I are honored to serve as the Alumni Association representatives on the presidential search committee. In addition, Student Body President Jessica Van Ranken, who also sits on the Alumni Association Board, and former Board Chair Jerry Boettcher '63 also serve on the committee. Rest assured that we are keeping your interests in mind as we interview qualified, experienced candidates and make a recommendation to the Board of Regents.

In closing, the Alumni Association is strong and our future is bright because of the passion of K-Staters from around the world. Thank you for your continued support of the Alumni Association and Kansas State University!

- Special celebration for 100 years of Homecoming showcasing traditions and building connections among the many generations of Wildcats.








- Partnered with colleges and departments for increased alumni engagement.
- Expanded Junior Wildcats Club to include kids age 2-12. The club had 686 members in 2016.

multicultural and international alumni events by more than 20 percent, while the participation in those events increased by nearly 500 percent. Last year, the Alumni Association was recognized by K-State's Office of International Programs with the Outstanding Support for International Initiatives award.

We all have many fond memories of our experiences at K-State so it's natural that alumni want to help future K-Staters have the same experience by supporting our student scholarship programs. Every year we continue to increase the number and the amount of scholarships we award to K-State students. In 2016, we paid out \$395,075 in scholarships to 444 students. We couldn't have done it without your support.

Last year we were honored to announce that we will add a fourth Wabash CannonBall gala to our successful series of Wabash CannonBall galas in Kansas City, Colorado and Houston. In 2016, we awarded \$168,750 in student scholarships as a result of funds raised during the three Wabash CannonBall events. The new gala will be held in North Texas on May 19, 2017.

Communications plays an important role in helping our Wildcat community stay connected. Last year we were able to enhance our communications efforts by redesigning our website and @K-State monthly e-newsletter. We hope you are enjoying these improvements and we are always interested in




