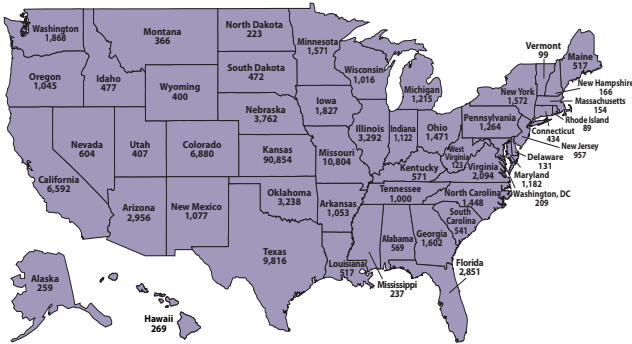

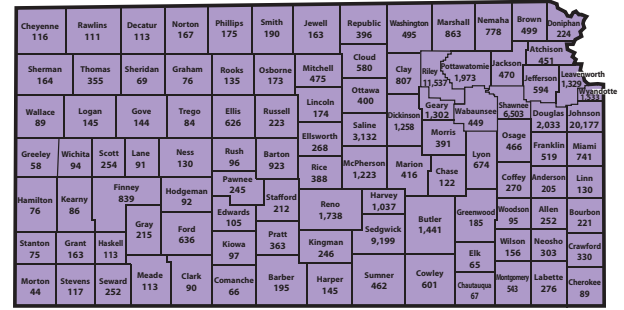

The K-State Alumni Association and KSU Foundation launched Wildcat Connection on April 17, 2006. This new online community was created to help alumni and friends stay connected with each other and the university. Users may view their biographical data maintained by the Association, update information, search for other K-Staters and utilize a career networking feature.

For future K-Staters, Born to be a Wildcat was developed to provide an opportunity for family to introduce K-State to children at an early age and encourages those first steps in life as a K-States. This program also will begin to establish a much needed legacy database for the university.

This 2005-06 summary of K-State Alumni Association activities from the current annual report is categorized by the strategic initiatives set by the board of directors. Information was current as of June 30, 2006.

#### Member Services

To create value for members, continually increase membership and operate profitable and unique affinity programs.

- Membership totaled 37,661.
- Remained ranked No. 1 in the Big 12 for percentage of members to graduates for the 10th consecutive year.
- Wildcats Forever membership reached 674 in its third year.
- All nine colleges participated in the college membership gift program.

- The affinity card program had 17,011 participants.
- The Tradition Founders Fund raised \$272,011.
- AIA and Liberty Mutual insurance affinity agreements raised \$22,519.
- Sale of merchandise/ShopK-State.com totaled \$62,951.
- Nelnet, a consolidated student loan program, generated \$28,350 in its third year.

#### Communications

Serve as a link between alumni, friends and the university by providing clear information through high quality publications, supporting and promoting Association programs. Establish effective two-way communication with alumni and friends.

- Produced more than 350 communications jobs (including

publications, graphic e-mails and other promotional jobs in support of the Association) and sent 76 news releases for Association events.

- Produced four issues of the *K-Stater* magazine.
- Logged 451,786 user visits on the Association's Web site.
- E-mailed @K-State electronic newsletter to 43,386 recipients each month.

#### Information Services

Provide support for Alumni Association and university programming and fund-raising efforts by maintaining information about alumni and friends, as well as corporations and business organizations.

- Managed more than 243,000 records on the database.
- Added more than 9,000 new records to the database.
- Maintained 58,300 e-mail addresses in the Association's database.

- Processed 523 list/label requests for university departments and in-house Association programs.
- Added 1,659 Wildcat Connection users.

#### Programs

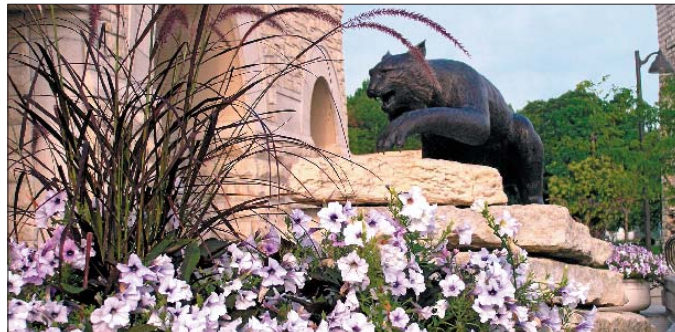
Identify and incorporate programs that build and maintain relationships that link K-Staters with the university.

- Recruitment activities reached 2,768 prospective K-State students.
- Constituent events and Alumni Clubs reached more than 12,000 K-Staters.
- Athletic events sponsored by the Association and Catbacker events brought together more than 9,700 alumni and friends.
- Student programming and multicultural events reached 13,701 current K-State students.
- 351 K-Staters traveled with the Traveling Wildcats program on 24 trips.
- 370 new Born to be a Wildcat participants.
- Provided \$142,000 for university student scholarships.

#### Enterprise Management

Provide financial direction, strategic planning and support for Association staff and programs through guidance and development of new and existing relationships.

- Sent more than 3,050 cards, letters and gifts through the public relations program.
- The Association president served on the Nelnet, NEATrust and Intra advisory boards.
- More than 58,000 alumni, students and friends attended 628 events held in the Alumni Center.
- The Association staff continued to be recognized professionally through speaking engagements and awards.
